### WANT A SERMON ON A CERTAIN TOPIC OR SCRIPTURE? ASK NOW!

If you have ever wanted to hear a certain topic addressed in a sermon, the time to ask is now. Is there a favorite scripture you would like as the text for preaching? Is there a puzzling scripture or topic you would like to see addressed from the pulpit? Do you have a suggestion for a sermon series? Or do you have another idea you would like to suggest for worship? In any of these cases, now is the time to make your input.

I may be living dangerously, but it seems like a good time to ask input from the congregation on preaching. I have appreciated the opportunity to preach on a variety of texts and topics, since I arrived September 15, 2000, and you have listened. With rare exception, the text and/or topic has been set by the season of the year, a special occasion, one or more of the suggested scriptures from the lectionary or my own inspiration. After 10 years it seems like the time to let you tell me what I may have left out that you would like addressed, or what bears repeating. Do you experience any “itches” that I have not “scratched” over the years, or that need some attention again?

Be aware that I will not stop preaching, if you make no suggestions. The more I preach the more on which I find to preach. One of the things I love about being a pastor is the opportunity to continue to wrestle with scriptures for their message to us, to seek to discern what God is doing today, to see what issues in our lives or the church or the world need addressed with “a word of the Lord” (which I hope I am receiving faithfully). I am sure that I do not always correctly interpret God’s revelation, since I am human and I come at life and scripture from my own experience and perspective, even as I try my best to hear Christ’s voice and not just my own thoughts.

At its best preaching is a “word from God” that comes from the confluence of scripture, the contemporary context of the congregation in the world, and the experience and best insight of a faithful preacher. It is not preaching if it does not engage the Bible, as our source book to know God. It is not effective preaching if it does not take into consideration the current world in which we live. And it is not authentic preaching, if it does not come through the heart, mind and experience of the particular preacher. I believe the Gospel is “incarnational.” In Jesus Christ the divine took on humanity, because that is how God chose to reach us. Even so, God continues to work incarnationally via his Holy Spirit which dwells in each of us individually, in the Church as a whole, and in the world. All are flawed and fallen, but all are graced by God’s presence. Thus I have hope that my human effort in a sermon is joined by God’s grace to bring alive the living message of Christ.

So please complete and return the opposite column of this article with your idea—or write them on a sheet of paper and turn them in. In the first 5 years I was here, I did a series on The Lord’s Prayer and on the 7 Deadly Sins; either could be addressed again in a new series. Other sermon series ideas I have had include: The Apostles’ Creed, The 10 Commandments or key “Methodist” beliefs and emphases. Do any of

these sound good to you? And/or do you have another suggestion for a series. I will try to work with all of your ideas, while I seek God’s guidance, and retain my own discretion.
