Congregations Acting for Justice and Empowerment have been listening to members of our congregations to hear their community concerns. Here are some concerns that have been heard from Central UMC members:

- Increased drug use in and around Evansville
- Possible loss of Warrick County Drug Court
- Need for improvements to and expansion of Child Protective Services
- Continued need for more public transportation
- Persistent homelessness
- Inadequate child psychiatric services
- Emergency service (ambulance) monopoly that is very expensive
- Need for expansion of the dental clinic
- Keeping jobs in Evansville

CAJE congregations continue to compile issues that are raised in their listening process. CAJE will hold its Annual Assembly at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, November 18 at Nazarene Baptist Church to pick a new issue. All Central Justice Ministry Network Members are urged to attend and vote. Before the end of the year, a research team will be formed and begin meeting to identify a strategy to tackle the adopted issue. Stay tuned to learn which issue is adopted and how that issue will be addressed. Central’s CAJE team will keep you posted as we progress through CAJE’s process that leads to the Nehemiah Action in April.

PROPOSAL APPROVED; WORSHIP AT 9:30 STARTS DECEMBER 5

The recommendations of the Worship Study Task Force as modified by the Church Council and presented to the Church Conference on October 10 were approved by a ballot vote. Beginning in January we will have two worship services, one traditional and one more contemporary, both held concurrently at 9:30 a.m. Sunday School will follow at 10:45 a.m. However, we will have a combined communion service using a blended format monthly, in addition to occasional combined services for special events or times of the year. Planning teams for each service will be established and operate in conjunction with the existing Worship Team and the pastor. Except for vacation the pastor will preach every week at the traditional and/or combined service, and the contemporary service will be lay-led. The intent is to implement this plan beginning in January for a two year period, in order to give adequate time to work out any difficulties that arise and fully evaluate the effects of this change.

The Worship Team has decided to have one service at 9:30 a.m. in the Sanctuary throughout December. We will be together for those Sundays and ease into the new schedule. On January 2, we will have communion with elements of the Wesley Covenant Service. Two services at 9:30 will begin on January 9.

CHURCH STAFF VACATION POLICY

The following outlines the vacation policy for our staff. The Pastor policy is mandated from the Indiana Conference. The Lay staff is determined by the parish.

Pastor: All Pastors serving full or part time a charge or Conference position within the Indiana Conference shall be granted, and are strongly encouraged, to take annual minimum vacations between Annual Conference sessions according to the following schedule:

- Less than 5 years 3 weeks including Sundays
- 5 years or more 4 weeks including Sundays

The Pastor-Parish Relations Committee or appropriate supervisory committee should ask that the pastor report annually, preceding the Annual Conference regarding vacation time taken during the conference year.

In this schedule, “years of service,” is interpreted to mean effective years as indicated by the Conference Journal. “Vacation” is interpreted to mean freedom from any responsibility in the local church or charge, cluster, district, conference, area, jurisdictional, or General Conference. Vacation should be a time of rest, recreation, and renewal. It should not be considered by the church to mean the pastor would be working at church camp, attending a national convention for some board, commission, or committee of the Conference to which he/she may be a member, or such other activity.

Student pastors who reside on the charge shall be granted 2 weeks of paid vacation between Annual Conference sessions, including 2 Sundays, after completion of one full year of service from the first Sunday without regard to Annual Conference meeting. Lay Staff: Central UMC offers a paid time off (PTO) policy to all full-time employees and to part-time salaried employees. PTO may be used for illness, vacation, or as personal time. While it is understood that an employee may not be able to schedule time off in case of illness or family emergency, all non-emergency time off should be planned and approved.

It is recommended that employees keep at least 5 days in reserve in case of a serious illness or family need. Employees may carry over up to 10 days from one calendar year to the next. Employees accumulate one day of PTO per month in the first year of employment. After one full year of employment (years 2-5) PTO accumulates at 1¼ days per month. After 5 full years of employment (years 6-10) PTO accumulates at the rate of 1½ days per month. After 10 full years, PTO will accumulate at the rate of 1¾ days per month.

Days are earned as of the last day of each full month worked and paid days may only be taken as they are accrued. An employee may, on occasion, need to take unpaid days or hours. However, those instances should be rare. Further, excessive use of unpaid time may result in disciplinary action. In the event of termination, employees will be paid for PTO which is accrued but unused.

Part-time hourly employees and instrumental musicians contracted to play for a particular worship service do not receive paid holidays or other paid time off but may negotiate with their immediate supervisor for unpaid time off. Part-time salaried employees also do not receive holidays but may take some time off during the year without a loss of pay as long as they arrange for their responsibilities to be cared for in advance of their absences. Because job responsibilities vary so much among part-time professional staff, rather than try to develop a general policy for them, time off policies (how, when, and how much may be taken) for each will be written into their job descriptions or otherwise agreed with the Staff-Parish Relations Committee.
