RED BIRD MISSION AND HENDERSON SETTLEMENT

Last year the Red Bird Mission expanded their Food Pantry program by teaching the community to produce their own food by backyard gardening. This is Red Bird Mission’s 88th -year of providing health care (medical and dentistry) in the isolated, rural communities of southeastern Kentucky.
