JACC ANNUAL MEETING - NOVEMBER 15

The Jacobsville Area Community Corporations annual membership meeting is 6:00 p.m. Tuesday, November 15 at SWIRCA, 16 W. Virginia Street. Registration starts at 5:30 p.m. and the meeting starts at 6:00 p.m. with a full meal catered by DiLegge’s. If you become a member of JACC, which costs \$5 for residents of the JACC area and \$8 for others interested, the meal is free. After a brief business meeting as people finish eating, the program will begin at 6:30 p.m. Andy Frazier of the Indiana Association of Community Economic Developers will share the steps of community engagement, asset-based planning, quality of life visioning and action that they will assist neighborhood people and community partners (led by Habitat) to develop and keep going in the neighborhood. Lana Abel of the Evansville Redevelopment Commission will also explain more briefly a professionally-led process that will be used to update the master plan for the Jacobsville Redevelopment Area, which will be enlarged to include more of North Main Street.
