

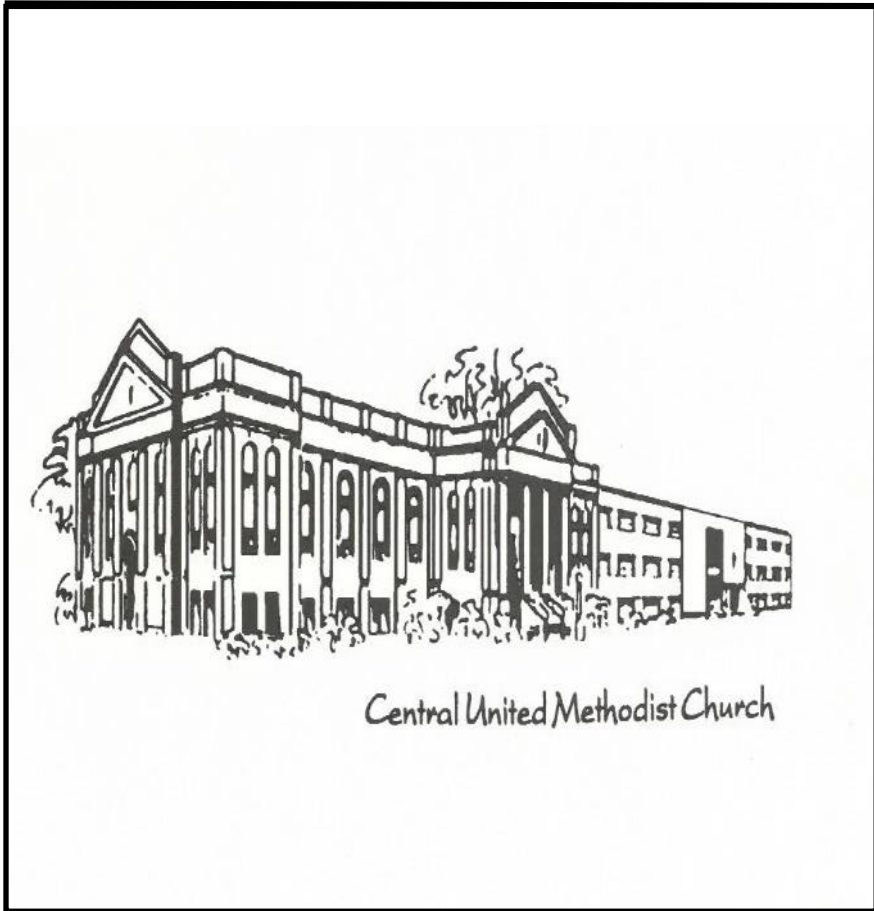

Revisiting the Passion: The Crucifixion

Mark 15.21-41

13 April 2025

*And when they crucified Him, they divided His garments, casting lots for them to determine what every man should take. **Mark 15.24***

The physical aspects of crucifixion-

- Roman-sanctioned form of execution
- The convicted person would die of asphyxiation
- The legs of the condemned were sometimes broken

The emotional aspects of crucifixion-

- Humbling and embarrassed for the convicted. He would be naked.
- A spectacle for the onlookers

The spiritual aspects of crucifixion-

- Jesus' death is a fulfillment of Old Testament, or Messianic, prophecy
- Jesus' becomes the "sin- sacrifice" for all humanity

Other Elements of Jesus' Crucifixion

- The seven last words (sayings) of Jesus
- Darkness during the day-
- Forgiving one thief- Luke 23.32-43
- No bones were broken- John 19.36; Exodus 12.46; Psalm 34.20
- The veil of the temple was torn- Matthew 27.51

Take Away Passage-

I once thought these things were valuable, but now I consider them worthless because of what Christ has done. Yes, everything else is worthless when compared with the infinite value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have discarded everything else, counting it all as garbage, so that I could gain Christ and become one with him. I no longer count on my own righteousness through obeying the law; rather, I become righteous through faith in Christ. For God's way of making us right with himself depends on faith. I want to know Christ and experience the mighty power that raised him from the dead. I want to suffer with him, sharing in his death, so that one way or another I will experience the resurrection from the dead!
