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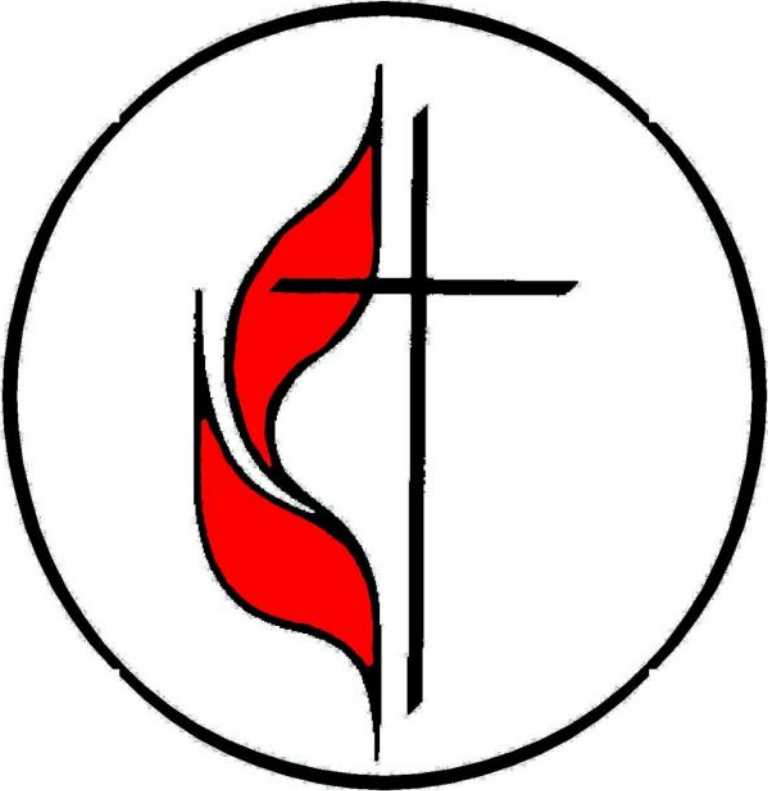

2026 REQUESTS ENDOWMENT FUND

The Central United Methodist Church Endowment Fund Governing Board invites requests for funding from the 2026 distribution. Applications should be submitted in writing with the amount requested and a brief statement of the need; requests must be received by August 1, 2026, and may be submitted to the church office, mailed to the church or submitted electronically to LTribble@gmail.com. Be sure to mark 'Endowment Request' on the envelope or subject line. The church address is:

All requests should be received by **August 1, 2026** and will be considered based on the amount of funding available for distribution.

SCHOLARSHIPS

The Central United Methodist Church Endowment Fund Governing Board invites applications for scholarships to be awarded from the 2026 distribution of funds. A summary of the scholarship guidelines is detailed below: Applicants should be high school graduates or scheduled to graduate at the end of the current academic year and be enrolled in an accredited post-secondary institution (2-year, 4-year, or graduate). The applicant must be classified as full-time and degree-seeking although a specific program of study (major) need not be declared. Successful applicants will be affiliated with Central United Methodist Church or its youth group. Up to \$10,000 may be distributed to qualified applicants with the maximum amount of \$1000 per student. This scholarship is intended for students with financial need.

Applicants should submit a short essay (500 words or less) detailing their plans for post-secondary education with a statement relating how their relationship to God has impacted their life and their academic goals. The deadline for applications is August 1, with awards to be made for the fall semester. Distribution of funds will be in September each year. Awards are unrestricted; that is, the money may be used for any expense directly related to the student's academic program (tuition, fees, room, board, books, supplies, etc.). Recipients are eligible to reapply in subsequent years, if full-time, degree-seeking enrollment is continued.

Why CRCC Awareness Training Matters

INUMC is intentionally offering CRCC Awareness Training for churches receiving Cross-Racial/Cross-Cultural clergy, with the intention of continuing this training throughout the

conference for all churches. This training is beneficial not only for preparing congregations to receive their incoming pastors, but also for strengthening evangelism and discipleship as we show hospitality to people coming into our churches.

CRCC Awareness Training helps churches prepare to receive an incoming pastor with hospitality, respect, humility, and love. It helps the congregation begin ministry with the pastor in a spirit of trust, openness, and grace, while also honoring the pastor's cultural background, leadership gifts, communication style, and ministry experience.

Sometimes differences in race, ethnicity, language, background, gifts, worship style, education, or socio-economic experience can become stumbling blocks when we are not prepared to welcome people who are not like us. The training helps congregations understand how to welcome people from diverse cultures into the life of the church. It enlarges the church's worldview and deepens appreciation for cultural differences. Through this training, churches are equipped to recognize those barriers and move beyond fear, assumptions, or discomfort. They become more open to different languages, traditions, leadership gifts, and community needs. In doing so, churches strengthen their witness, grow as disciples of Jesus Christ and included in the Body of Christ.
